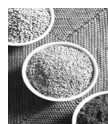


### **LIVING TOGETHER IN A GLOBALISED WORLD**

Gain an understanding of how maps and globes can be used to develop students' perceptions of their world. Practical and fun mapping and globe activities. Particularly suitable for lower primary teachers.

Use your experiences with achieving peace in the classroom to explore international peace and conflict. Including issues relating to peace making, peace keeping, peace building, humanitarian relief and development, disarmament and refugees.
